National Clean Cities Program

- *Clean Cities advances the energy, economic, and environmental security of the United States by supporting local actions to deploy alternative fuel technologies and efficiency measures*
- *U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) flagship alternative-transportation deployment initiative, sponsored by the Vehicle Technologies Office. Clean Cities has saved more than 8.5 billion gallons of petroleum since its inception in 1993*
- *Hosted by UCF and FSEC*






National Clean Cities Program

- *Nearly 100 coalitions with 15,000 stakeholders across U.S.*
- *Has awarded nearly \$400 million to fund hundreds of transportation projects nationwide, which have leveraged more than \$740 million in matching funds*
- *With MotorWeek, has helped produce over 100 national TV segments on transportation success stories*
- *Biodiesel, Ethanol, Electric Drive (EVs, PHEVs, HEVs), Propane, Natural Gas, & Fuel Conservation*

Central Florida Clean Cities Space Coast Reception


When: Tuesday, November 6th, 6:30-8:30








- *E-School Bus Emergency Energy System*
 - *Utilized at existing SunSmart School Emergency Shelters*
 - *Use E-Bus to provide more and longer duration power than existing battery storage*
 - *Develop interfaces and equipment*
 - *Develop resource management protocols for emergency planning and deployment*
 - *Partners: FDACS OOE, CFCCC, NREL, FMEA, FDEM and others*



- *E-School Bus Emergency Energy System*
 - *SunSmart Schools (118 PV systems in 46 counties)*

- *Promote electric transportation and infrastructure*

- *Volkswagen Settlement—Florida Mitigation Fund*
 - *Florida Department of Environmental Protection has lead on developing \$167 million plan*
 - *Draft plan expected at the end of October, followed by public comment period*
 - *Submit plan to federal Trustee by year's end, funding available 1st quarter of 2019**
 - *Plans are being approved on their merit as long as they adhere to guidelines*
 - *Structure of plan is not known and can be changed if need arises*

- Establishes a national network of alternative fueling and charging infrastructure along the national highway system
- The Central Florida Coalition is working with the State, multi-state Clean Cities Coalitions, the Federal Highway Administration, Drive Electric Florida and alternative fuel providers on a designation submission
- Designation submission will include all of Florida's Interstates and the Turnpike.



- *Alternative Fuel 1st Responder Training*
 - *Provides alternative fuel vehicle training for first responders and tow and salvage operators*
 - *Includes Train the Trainer for public safety instructors*
 - *Central Florida Coalition led initiative that includes collaboration with other Florida Coalitions*
 - *Conducted six workshops with other Coalitions and the State Fire College in Ocala*

The Central Florida Clean Cities Coalition (CFCCC) in collaboration with Florida's Southeast, Tampa Bay, and North Florida Clean Cities Coalitions, supports initiatives that encourage public and private fleet and consumer use of alternative fuel vehicles (AFV). Together, we cover 80 percent of the state's population.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES
US Department of Energy funding will allow the Florida Clean Cities Coalitions to provide first responder and tow operator safety training throughout the state with the creation of the Florida AFV Safety Training Network.

FIRST RESPONDER SAFETY TRAINING
In partnership with our local workforce agency, CareerSource Brevard, CFCCC offered Central Florida's public safety workforce the opportunity to attend the first responder safety training workshops developed by the National Alternative Fuels Training Consortium (NAFTC) and the NAFTC Train the Trainer (T3) program.
Forty first responder trainers received instruction allowing them to teach their fellow first responders about safety procedures when approaching an incident involving an electric and gaseous fuel vehicle. A total of 168 first responders have been trained through live classroom instruction and hands-on vehicle demonstrations. On-demand web-based instructional tools are also available.
