Description: Haiku is a Japanese form of poetry usually written about the natural world or environment. It often uses 17 syllables displayed in three lines of text. This typically includes five syllables in the first line, seven syllables in the second line and five syllables in the third line.

Directions: Pick one of the Haiku. Give it a title and draw a picture of what it means to you. Try writing and illustrating one of your own.
